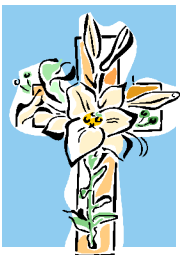
## Join Us in Saying Goodbye to Jeff & His Family

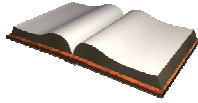

tions and conduct the search process to find new church staff for these two staff positions. With regard to the person we hire to lead the choir, our search team is asking some new questions. Such as: How can we encourage more congregational involvement in our traditional worship on Sunday mornings? How can we design our position description for the traditional worship director so that our many generations of members who play musical instruments and have experience in dramatic arts can regularly share in worship? During our search process, we asked for comments from present and past choir members about their views on what we should look for in the next choir director. Their responses to this request have been reviewed and taken to heart. This input has helped the search team to broaden the scope and function of the position.

With regard to our search for a new youth director, we have

assembled a team which is represented by the Personnel Commission chair, four of our youth, and four parents of youth, and me. We are meticulously reviewing the current position description and mapping out a plan for how we will conduct the search. There is a commitment by all of us to keep the spiritual focus and relational continuity currently driving the Jr. and Sr. High groups alive and thriving into the future.

I hope you share your gratitude to Karen and Jeff for all they and their loved ones have given to us. I also ask you to pray for our search teams. We need creative, bold, and wise discernment in these searches.



As the month of April approaches, spring is coming. Earlier in March we "sprung ahead" our clocks. This is a good reminder to check your smoke alarms to be safe. In fact, check everything in your home to be safe. They are saying that we will eventually have a major earthquake in our area. Are you ready? If there is a major earthquake do you know to drop and cover under a table? Do not call anyone until after it is over and make sure you have a portable radio, water, food supply, batteries, and supplies for your pets (if necessary). In 2001 we had an earthquake here in Seattle and I was at work

and was a cane user. There was total pandemonium at work so they sent us home. On the freeways and busses there was total chaos. (I believe it was a 6.8 earthquake). Can you imagine what it would be like if we experienced an earthquake like they did in Japan?

You must be safe and prepared. My guide dog, Polo's primary function is to keep me safe. When Polo and I are in church please ask me if it is ok to pet him because this is a safety issue for me. Until next time . . .

Thank you for your time and effort in collecting items you no longer need for our rummage sale. All proceeds go to youth missions, programs, and activities, helping us to share the Gospel and bring young people to Christ.

- \* **Should I price things?** No; volunteers will price items. For unique items, please do suggest prices or perhaps print out online information to go along with the item.
- \* **When and where do I drop items off?** April 25-April 29<sup>th</sup> in the Youth Room (old Fellowship Hall). See page 7 for a complete schedule.
- \* **What are you going to do with all the stuff that doesn't sell?** Leftover goods will be donated to the Salvation Army, picked up by their truck right after the sale.
- \* **Is the rummage sale open to the public?** Yes!
- \* **I have a couple of extra Bibles.** We will give away any donated Bibles—all versions and types—for free.
- \* **Should I leave clothing on hangers?** Yes. Folded clothing is OK too.
- \* **How are you going to hang all the clothing in the Upper Room?** We have portable garment racks, but need more. If you have a portable garment rack we can borrow, contact Heidi Linsky at 425-861-8269.
- \* **I have the instruction booklet for this pressure cooker that I've never used. Do you want it?** Yes; attach user manuals or information booklets if you have them.
- \* **Should I leave price tags on new items?** Yes; a "New" table will identify all brand new items with store-bought price tags still attached.
- \* **Are you still having the rummage sale with Youth Director Jeff Dennis leaving?** Yes! Jeff's last day is the same day as the Rummage Sale (Sat., April 30<sup>th</sup>).
- \* **Can I get a receipt for donations?** Yes. Donation receipts are available at drop off.
- \* **Do you need help with the sale?** Attend our volunteer meeting Tuesday, April 26<sup>th</sup> at 7:00PM in the Upper Room. Or, contact the committee (see page 7).
- \* **Will there be a food stand?** Stop by the youth-run **Snack Shack** for coffee, pastries, a hot dog, and other refreshments.
- \* **What if it rains?** The sale is on, rain or shine, in the Upper Room.
- \* **Paying at the Sale: Can I pay with credit cards or checks?** No credit or debit cards – bring cash or checks. A "hold" area will hold your items if you need to leave and get cash or your checkbook.
- \* **Bargaining at the Sale: This is marked \$1.75, will you take \$1 for it?** With the volume of items we anticipate, no price negotiating! The sale runs from 9:00AM—3:00PM; all items are 50% off the marked price from 1:00—3:00PM, the last two hours of the sale.
